## Guatemala: Changes in Minimum Wage to Increase in 2020

For workers in non-agricultural, maquila and export activities, the minimum wage will increase by 3% this year in relation to what was paid in 2019.

Government agreement 320-2019, published in Diario de Centroamérica on December 30, 2019, specifies that the minimum monthly wage for agricultural activities will remain unchanged for the second consecutive year, and will continue at \$388.12.

The official document explains that the minimum monthly wage for non-agricultural



activities rose from \$355.69 in 2019 to \$366.42 in 2020, equivalent to a 3% increase. When the \$32.43 bonus is added, the payment will rise to \$398.85.

For maquila and export workers the increase in the monthly minimum wage was 2.93%, rising from \$325.31 in 2019 to \$334.86 in 2020. With the bonus of \$32.43, the total payment will be \$367.29.

China businesses in Shanghai and Beijing will attempt to open but the big electronic supplier Foxconn was told by the government to stay closed. The number of businesses which will be able to open will depend upon how many workers return from the holiday or decide to stay away for fear of contracting the virus. The automotive sector is being hit hard as the short supply of parts is forcing some assembly plants to slow down or close, with Suzuki considering sourcing parts elsewhere for their India production, their largest.
